Stuart was a former resident of Harrietsham who lived in one of the cottages in Rectory Lane near its junction with East Street. Clipper ships were built in the mid 19th Century for speed, primarily to carry tea as quickly as possible from India and China to the UK and America to obtain the best possible prices.
